In line with this principle the Company is committed to ensure the prevention and the minimisation of the environmental impacts arisen from its operations throughout the continuous improvement of the Company environmental performances.

The Company Policy address, through the compliance with all applicable legislations and standards, to conduct all its activities in order to pursue the following principles:

- To prevent damage to the environment applying Environmental Impact Assessment procedure in relation to both existing and planned operations and from seismic exploration to decommissioning phases
- · To aim at meaningfully protecting socio-economic structures and the environment
- · To consider cumulative effects on the receiving environment
- To prevent and minimise the environmental impacts of water consumption and discharges and hazardous and non hazardous wastes disposal
- · To minimise or optimise the use of chemicals or substitute less toxic chemicals
- To require that contractors, subcontractors, and all parties working on their behalf to fully be in compliance with Company Environmental requirements
- To undertake appropriate reviews and evaluations of its operations to measure progress and to ensure compliance with this policy.

Each employee are responsible for environmental protection relevant to all tasks performed by himself or by the personnel under their control and has to report to his supervisor any environmentally damaging acts or conditions.

The personnel has to be adequately trained in both general awareness of environmental issue and specific procedures aimed at the avoidance of environmental damages so they will contribute within the Company to the achievement of the best practicable environmental performances.

Company Health Policy

ACCO – Libya (Company) consider the protection and promotion of health of both its personnel and local community a priority in its activities, this implies the recognition, evaluation and control of the factors, which may adversely affect health, and its range of application is from the design stage through to the operational phase.

The Company is committed and give emphasis to the prevention of work related illnesses, protection of the worker's health and promotion of his health and well-being.

Occupational health, concerned with the diagnosis, management and prevention of diseases due to, or exacerbated by, workplace factors, will be based on a proactive health risk management approach.

Health risk assessments will take place from start phase (evaluation) to the abandonment of the projects (decommissioning). Although initial health risk assessment take place in the design stage and early stage of operations, it remains an ongoing activity as the validity of observations may expire and processes may change in time.

Risk assessment, risk control and risk reduction measures will be in place.

Health surveillance, instruction and training, first aid and medical emergency treatment, health promotion initiatives as information of the personnel on occupational health policies and on general health and risks related to life style and environment will be assured by Company

The Company believes that it is important to consider impact of business on health of surrounding host community.

As high priority, the Company will ensure an early and on ongoing dialogue with the host government and other relevant stakeholders for health related issues coming from its operations and business.

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Company is committed to guarantee personnel health protection and well-being in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, finalized to a continuous improvement process.

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Company Driving Policy

ACCO – Libya recognize the threat of injury to health as a result of accident while driving or use both Company's car and private car during work activities and commutation. The Company will ensure that every employee requested to drive a vehicle has all the needed credentials: a valid driving license, the necessary training and skill, good physical condition. The drivers will be aware of its responsibility.
